



Research opportunities

The BSR welcomes being involved in bids for research funding. This is a very important way of showing our connectedness to UK HEIs. It helps enormously if the bid is discussed with us in advance.

Where we are consulted we will offer to write letters of support, to connect your research with our research themes, and to provide other advice and help.

Currently we are still eligible to be included in ERC funding bids. We are not eligible for indirect costs, but would hope to negotiate intelligent deals with partners. This makes us a potentially very cost-effective mechanism.
