Archbishop Cranmer	Studentship	£7,000	Church of England between the years AD 1500 and 1700	Applicants must be, or about to become, registered as a graduate student in the University by 1st October 2023.
Ellen McArthur	Grant	£1,500	Economic History	Any person who is or is about to become registered as a graduate student in the University on 1st October 2022. Academic staff working within the field of Economic and Social History are also eligible, regardless of whether they are members of the Faculty of History. The managers of the fund shall prioritise applications for travel costs, however other proposed expenses might be considered.

Senior members of the University and those registered as graduate students in the University. Preference will be given to members of the Faculty of History.
Holland Rose	Grant	£1,000	Commonwealth	Any person who is or is about to become registered as a graduate student in the University on 1st October 2023.
Holland Rose	Studentship	£2,000	Commonwealth	Applicants must be already researching or intend to undertake research on the history of a Commonwealth country or former Commonwealth country. Applicants should have graduated with “high honours” in History or in some other subject deemed relevant by the fund managers. See more criteria on Faculty website.
Dr Lightfoot	Grant	£2,000	Ecclesiastical History	Applicants must be, or about to become, registered as a graduate student in the University by 1st October 2022.
Dr Lightfoot	Studentship	£7,000	Ecclesiastical History	Applicants must be, or about to become, registered as a graduate student in the University by 1st October 2023.
Members' History	Grant	£1,000	N/A	Those registered as graduate students in the University, specifically those under the supervision of the Degree Committee of the Faculty of History.
Prince Consort	Prize	£1,500	N/A	All doctoral graduates of the University and all those who are registered as doctoral graduate students in the University.

Studentships may be awarded for the study of any field of history.
